CEO's Report

ooking back over the 2014-15 reporting period we can look back with a great sense of achievement at progress made, work completed, and goals achieved. We can never rest on these things, there is much more to do to secure the work of MMM long into the future.

In recent years we have been dealing with the structural issues with the budget at MMM Australia. The costs associated with operating a hands-on volunteer missions organisation such as MMM have escalated significantly on the past 10 years and the work associated with compliance and reporting means that we can't operate the way we did 30 years ago. The structural reform needed was no small ask, and realistically we needed 2 - 3 years to effect the changes necessary. Significant costs needed to be taken out of the expenditure side and we needed to dramatically increase our revenue from fundraising donations and sacrificial giving of our supporters.

In 2013/14 I was asked to develop a 5 year strategic plan for the mission to identify key goals, and the strategies needed to achieve them. Financial sustainability was at the top of the list, and for good reason. Unless we are sustainable we have no future! I travelled to New Zealand in September 2014 to present at the 20th anniversary celebrations for MMM NZ. My initial thought was I would outline the strategic



Plan as part of my presentation, this all changed following a time of prayer 24 hours prior to the meetings.



I was challenged by God to focus the mission on prayer, that everything we wanted to achieve, and everything we would need would come as a result of our prayerful heart. So in 2014/15 year we have focussed on our prayer network, we have focussed on prayer in everything and for everything. It would be easy for me to strive to achieve the goals through the strategies we had identified but when God challenges us we must be obedient.

2014/15 has been a year of challenges as we worked to implement structural reform of our budget position, God has honoured His work, we have seen his blessing. But like the Apostle James I can say we have seen our faith working through the works we have done. We are a faith based mission, we will remain a faith based mission, and we will put our faith to work using the gifts that God has blessed each of us with.

I'm pleased to report that through the grace and goodness of God we have seen a significant turnaround in the mission, in all areas, including our finances. It's a joy to report that in the last financial year we recorded a modest cash surplus. We can't rest here, there is still much to do, but we are making progress in the right direction. Our prayer network is growing, but there is still more to do. Our volunteer base needs more people to share the load, but we have seen answers to prayer for help in Western Australia and Queensland. We have seen a significant uptake in Build-A-Bond projects requests, but we need more help in this area with design and production.

As we move forward, the most pressing need is for faithful people to pray. Pray for our finances, pray for our region managers, pray for new volunteers, pray for safety and security on work projects, pray for protection as we travel across the continent to project sites. Pray for effective communication with churches and mission groups about what we do and how we can help.

I'm looking forward to a challenging year in 2015/16 and I'm looking forward to seeing what God does and how He does it through the gifts and talents He has placed within MMM Australia.

n August 1st, 2015 MMM turned 40. From humble beginnings in 1975 MMM has grown to be represented in all areas of Australia, the South Pacific, Asia, and Africa. We've completed work projects in over 40 countries and had thousands of volunteers and many more supporters that joined us for part or all, of that journey.

On August 1st a group of people met at the MMM Offices in Mitcham Victoria to pray, chat, and celebrate the 40th Anniversary. Two of the original founders were present along with many supporters and volunteers from the past 40 years.

In October (16th – 18th) we held the 40 Years Strong Conference at Belgrave Heights in Victoria where representative from MMM across the globe came together for a time of Ministry, updates, and celebration. These images are a small snapshot of these two events, and reflect the great fellowship enjoyed by past and present MMM'ers.

































Build-A-Bond Report

MM Build-A-Bond had a relatively quiet year in 2013/14 with only one major project, in contrast 2014/15 has been busier, and as we look forward to 2016 things are looking even busier again. We had three main projects during the last twelve months, along with several smaller ones. The key projects were:

Vanuatu – 'Onesua' Presbyterian School staff houses and dormitory.

This project consisted of six buildings– five duplex staff houses and one boys' dormitory. Processing of this consumed over 7000 metres of Role-Form steel that took around 420 man hours to process. Many more additional hours in the work of design, drawings, transport, and communications.

The conclusion of our part of the project was with a team of 21 men from five or six different churches in Victoria and Tasmania who travel to Vanuatu and assemble and erect these structures. These men travelled at their own expense using three weeks of their own time. In true MMM style we partnered with a team had the help of 18 local men who gave valuable assistance in much of the construction and repair work.

We had schedule three weeks on-site and we're pleased to report the project went

very smoothly and was completed with about a week to spare. This time was then used to do additional work on cyclone damaged buildings on the school campus.

Mitcham - Samaritan's Purse office.

The Samaritan's Purse office building is an internal structure, 6.3m x 3.8m. The walls and ceiling were manufactured from approximately 400m of Role-Form steel and then put together in the Samaritan's Purse Mitcham packing facility by MMM Vic volunteers (including our CEO who gave up a day or so of his time to join the team. Other MMM volunteers assisted in completing the building ready for occupation.

This office will assist Samaritan's Purse in processing and delivering approximately 70,000 shoe-box gift packs to children throughout South-East Asia this Christmas, and for years to come.

Port Morseby P.N.G. – Drug rehab accommodation block.

These two buildings for the drug rehab accommodation in Port Morseby were processed from 2700 m of Role-Form steel and is currently stored at MMM, Mitcham, awaiting shipment in January to Papua New Guinea.

Other Projects

A number of small projects have also been completed during the past twelve months, including single wall construction, office partitions, and small building & Sheds.

Currently there are several enquiries being processed that have the potential to become significant projects in 2016 and beyond, these include churches, schools, and housing. These project sites include Australia, Africa, Indonesia, and the South Pacific.

Much thanks and appreciation to the many volunteers that have helped in the Mitcham facilities to produce the Role-Steel, delivery and loading to shipping containers and to site. Thanks also to all the volunteer team members who have worked on Build-A-Bond projects on site. We are always looking for volunteers, and we're also looking for skilled designers, and structural engineers to help with this vital part of our MMM ministry.

MMM Build-A-Bond









2015 has been a year of progress in the prayer networks of MMM. We continually give thanks for the network of people who contribute what God puts on their heart which we can then collate into the prayer communications. Our contributors include Region Managers, our CEO Terry Baxter, Noel Taylor & Kim Roediger (Build-A-Bond Team), Rob Dux & Maaike Naude (MMM Build), Ross & Heather Henson, and the Overseas MMM Centre Directors.

Most importantly we thank God for those who pray for MMM and for His many answers to our prayers, to bless people and grow His kingdom & MMM. We've also had several prayer initiatives throughout the year that have seen real results, these include; **Prayer Fellowships.** The number of groups & those attending has grown but still needs to grow further. Next year QLD & NSW Centres will hold monthly prayer meetings as the other Centres do. Tasmania has 3 prayer groups. We are establishing a prayer group in South Australia early in 2016, thanks to Rose-Mary Hunt's enthusiasm. The monthly Mitcham office prayer fellowship has an average of twelve prayer supporters attending regularly for lunch first, then praying for 1hr, using the PowerPoint. Head office staff also attends these prayer fellowships.

Day of prayer this year, Feb 18, had 41 individuals & various teams around Aust & overseas praying for MMM between 4.30am & 10:00pm, in 30 minute time slots, using prayer guidelines I sent to assist. We witnessed great results from this event and will be planning more in the next year.

Monthly Prayer Force. The new format this year has been very well received. PrayerForce is available on the MMM website & via email to around 230 prayer supporters. We also post out around 320 each month. Through the generosity and faithful giving from MMM supporters approximately \$750 was donated towards the mailing costs for around 320 copies of PF each month, which was very encouraging. Monthly prayer PowerPoint is emailed to 230 on my contact list & a hard copy posted to a few who can't receive email. This year we have also started distributing MS Word version of these prayer points to make it easier to print on home printers.

PrayerNet is current high priority prayer points not included in other prayer communications and is sent to 780 Associates, via our broadcast email service. Our broadcast cast email system reports an average of 43% open the PrayerNet email each time.

Team News now includes prayer notes from Region Managers that relate to each state/region and a dedicated message on prayer on the rear page.

We endeavour to hold a staff and volunteers devotion & prayer time each Wednesday morning. Although this has been somewhat sporadic with people's availability, we're working towards being much more consistent in 2016.

Our Prayer ministry is the most vital component of what MMM does, and will remain the primary focus of off-site activities for MMM Australia. Thanks to everyone for your prayer support and commitment.

Region Reports: Victoria/South Australia



S ince the 2009 fires the regional office in Victoria has been incorporated into the head office operations. With a loss of resource and significant HR issues to deal with this was a prudent course of action at the time.

Over time the lack of a Victorian Committee and region manager has slowly but significantly impacted the operational efficiency of the Victorian team. Without the personal leadership and guidance of a dynamic region manager the co-ordination of work has largely been handled by the role of a national projects co-ordinator, in recent years this work was superbly handled by Peter Taylor but since his retirement in 2014 the need for a region manager and state committee's in both Victoria and South Australia has become imperative.

In 2015 David Graham has volunteered to co-ordinate the projects in the Vic/SA region, this has been a steep learning curve for David but a task he has grasped well and run with over the past 8 months despite dealing with significant family and health issues. Church Projects at New Gisborn, Seymour Presbyterian Church (3 separate work teams), 1330 Church, Horsham Presbyterian Church, Kaniva Presbyterian Church. The Vic team also completed mission support projects at Yarra Junction, and Yellingbo with much thanks from all church and missions organisations.

Throughout the year we formed a Vic State Committee, headed up by Hugh Stubley, with involvement from David Graham, Ivan Wadsworth, Ewe-Jin Low, and Janina De Silva. Unfortunately without a region manager to provide ongoing leadership and limited time availability from the committee volunteers it has once again found itself in hiatus. A key component of driving forward will be to appoint a region manager and get the committee functioning effectively.



Overall we have made progress throughout this reporting period with a small group of committed project team members and support form mobile teams from other regions.

Overriding much of this year was the project for MMM Build at Summerhill Baptist's new facility. David Meadows (Project Manager), Cecilia Louwrens, and Andrew Rogers did a brilliant job in seeing this new worship facility come to fruition while also working in other areas of the state.

In January the Tassie Safari, led by Phil and Gwen Hall, assisted in

maintenance and renovation works at Emmanuel Christian School, Blue Lagoon Campsite, GLO Smithton campus, C3 Church Wynyard, Worldview Centre Launceston, and Camp Clayton Ulverstone. This safari team really showed what MMM volunteers are all about, accomplishing amazing outcomes for these organisations and helping restore and renovate their facilities. Western Australia



MMWA has continued to experience God's direction and leading throughout the 2014-15 year. We began the year sending out our biggest project team for a number of years, 8 gents in all, travelling to Bridgetown Church of Christ to complete renovations on their church hall. This team introduced two new volunteers who would begin their journey of "Serving those who Serve" through the ministry of MMM and continued to do so throughout the year, it's great to see the team growing in 2015.

The distances travelled to projects were vast, with projects undertaken as far away as Bay of Isles Church in Esperance (South), Kurrawang Aboriginal Community near Kalgoorlie (East) and Wandalgu Mission near Geraldton (North). Other Projects included SU Camp Geographe Busselton, East Victoria Baptist Perth, Camp Wattle Grove, Inglewood Community Church, Grace Bible Fellowship Maylands, Mundijong Uniting Heritage Church and Esther Foundation South Perth.

Each Volunteer who is willing to commit their time and bring their skills to a project is a blessing. We were blessed this year with two couples who made the journey from the East to help out for extended periods. This was a real encouragement and has reignited the passion for future Safari teams or Individuals to follow in their steps. Rod Heape, MMM's longest serving fulltime volunteer relocated back to Western Australia from New Zealand to take up residence with us at the MMMWA Centre. Rod is now kept busy with a scheduled maintenance program at our partner school Thornlie Christian College where the WA Centre is located, and leading local project teams; his experience and knowledge have been a great asset.

The Wandalgu Mission, 80klms west of Geraldton, is part of the Sun City Church, Geraldton. This property has over 35 buildings that will need to be renovated over coming years to accommodate displaced persons or those facing addictions who have been reach by the church through its ministries. MMMWA placed a Volunteer for 3 months on the property to act as a Project Manager and contact person for other MMM work parties and individuals travelling to the area. The Wildflower season was a great time to see the splendour of God's handy work. Wandalgu Mission will be a Project Focus over the coming years.

Throughout the year the women's ministry team were very busy with monthly craft days teaching Patchwork, Cake Decorating and Mosaics, two shopping tours, and a High Tea & Petticoat Lane Market. They also work hard on the success of our annual celebration dinner.

The regional committee also had the opportunity to participate in a number of local church services throughout the year, along with our CEO Terrence Baxter who ministered one Sunday and shared the MMM story at Thornlie Church of Christ. Projects Admin

hroughout the 2014/15 reporting period MMM Australia received 138 project requests of which 83 have been approved for regional engagement. At the commencement of December the workflow procedures for the assessment and approval of requested projects was reviewed and amended to reflect a regionalised assessment process where region committee and the region managers had the majority of the input and the final acceptance or rejection of project requests.

We continue to process requests received at a corporate level against the overall MMM Charter:

- Is this a Christian organisation
- Is this facility primarily used for the spread of the Gospel
- Is this facility supporting Christian Mission of Missionaries
- Is MMM Capable of completing this work

The project request is then responded to and dispatched to the relevant regional office for detailed review and a final decision. This process has allowed a much better review with local knowledge and better assessment of timeframes for completion. Overall we completed 54 projects across Australia in 2014/15.

Workplace Health & Safety remains one of the highest priorities on all projects undertaken by MMM Australia. In the 2014/15 reporting period we recorded only 2 minor workplace incidents, none resulted in any serious injury or on-going medical treatment. Over this period we recorded in excess of 29,000 project hours (on-site) in addition to this approximately 2500 hours of project work was completed off site mostly by the Build-A-Bond team preparing work projects in the Mitcham facilities.

Development of a new projects administrations database was commenced through the volunteer support of David Kenyan, completion is expected early in 2016. This will simplify reporting and tracking of project and WH&S information and allow the closure of the current Microsoft Dynamics database which is overly complex and costly to operate.

 Grace Tree Community Church, Coburg – Oratory. The project provides a tranquil place of prayer. The roof lantern serves as a distinctive feature, allows natural light to flood into the octagonal shaped building and gives the illusion of space. Eco-sensitive products include recycled bricks, timber posts and doors. Mount Evelyn Christian School (MECS) – Administration. The project delivered an administration building to accommodate additional office space. The administration facility is a standalone building which at a later stage will be connected to the main school building by means of an extensive foyer space. This will create a new and enhanced 'front door' to the school.

 Flemington Road, North Melbourne -Home extension. The project creates a spacious and contemporary terrace residence through the construction of a two level rear extension. Rathdowne Street, Carlton VIC -Home renovation and extension. The project created a spacious inner city residence by doubling the floor area of this heritage listed terrace house. The new upper level was carefully designed to respond to the streetscape scale and rhythm. The rear extension required the floor level to be lowered to address overlooking issues and construction ensured no structural damage to the two adjoining residences.
