Shoebox House Making a New Home




Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project, brings joy and hope to needy children around the world through gift-filled shoe boxes and the Good News of God's love. Since 1993, more than 100 million shoe box gifts have been delivered to children in more than 130 countries.

This year MMMWA has been approached by Yvonne Richardson and asked for assistance with the building of Shoebox House in Southern River. After much prayer they have now secured a plot of land. Shoebox House Southern River was first established 10 years ago and its purpose was to create and make the resources and gifts needed to fill the shoeboxes. As it grew, it also became a collection point for others who were faithfully filling shoeboxes. The growing numbers of Volunteers' have seen a house that was made available for the group, filled to capacity as they meet weekly to produce items. However, their tenure at the current facility runs out at the end of this year.

The house and ministry of Operation Christmas Child has become a pillar in the community, a place where lonely or even marginalized folk gather with the purpose of filling boxes, but in doing so, also find hope, companionship and support.

In 2009 the Volunteer Team, who have now grown to over 40, received the "Premiers' Australia Day Active Citizenship award" and then in 2011 the "Recognition of Seniors for Service in the City of Gosnells and the Community at Large" by The Rotary Club of Kenwick.



The new Shoebox House will be purposely built and allow for more storage of completed items, bigger areas and work tables for Volunteers to work at and be more easily accessible to the local community. As this is a major build and the ministry of Operation Christmas has touched so many in our community, MMMWA is looking for Volunteers and Tradesman from far and wide to register their interest in this Project. Funds are being raised and faithful prayer warriors are praying through all aspects of the building process. 

New Beginnings in Thailand

In late April MMM CEO Terrence Baxter visited Thailand to negotiate the purchase of a parcel of land for our permanent base here in Chiang Rai. This past month was a bit crazy for both Pedro and Palita as they tried to work through the paperwork to purchase a plot of land for MMM in Thailand. We praise God for this provision! We also are grateful for MMM Australia and all the people who generously donated for this land. Even though God provided the funds to buy the land miraculously, we still need to work through the paperwork and process to get everything done legally according to Thai law.

Pedro had to drive 4 hours each way to get the owner of the land to sign some additional paperwork. Just He didn't know where the owner lived! So, he had to get directions as he drove. I don't know about you, but I don't like driving somewhere and not knowing where I'm going. As for Palita, the office administrator. It was her job to determine what paperwork we as a foundation

need to buy the land in MMM's name. Fortunately, Frank Smith (*a friend of Terry*) is married to an important person in Chiang Rai province who is involved with real estate and knows the process.

She agreed to help us. Palita may have thought it would be easy because this person helped Shoulder to Shoulder Foundation with the same process a few years earlier. She asked a member of her staff to help us with the process. Palita made an appointment with this person and went to the land department as scheduled. When they arrived for the meeting the employee and Palita got to see one of the top people in the Lands Department. Unfortunately they found out that this staff person had no clue how to purchase the land under a foundation either and advised them to consult the land officer from that moment on to determine what needed to be done.

Over the next few weeks the issues mounted and the problems kept coming (as far as the department is concerned), but we continued to do everything needed, including some amendments to the MMM Foundations by-laws (*constitution*) that were requested. Our CEO was assisting remotely with advise when needed. Contacting people that were needed at times in Thailand is difficult, particularly with other foundations where people have moved on. To change this section in the by-laws, we had to submit 3 sets of relevant documents to the Deputy District Chief of Chiang Rai. Then she would forward it to the governor of Chiang Rai for approval. All this paperwork had to be signed by the president of MMM in Thailand who lives about 30 minutes from MMM in Thailand office and the only time that he's available to sign this paperwork is at 8:30 am.

The paper work was submitted as required by the Deputy District Chief, but that same day I got a phone call asking for more information! Unfortunately Government officers in Thailand often ask for additional documents that were not on the original list – that's just the way it is! However hard the process is, we are reminded of the scripture from the Bible. "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." Colossians 3:17 . Instead of complaining about the process or the red tape, we learn to praise God, to give thanks to Him and do everything for God.



MMM PRAYER News

It's a Matter of Perspective



The image here at the top of the page is the most classic view of one of Australia's most iconic landmarks, Uluru. In ignorance to the traditional owners – the Anangu tribe, European settlers named the rock Ayres Rock and it took over 100 years for the traditional name to be recognised and brought into common use. You can show that picture in most countries of the world and people will identify it as Australian. Its appearance looks relatively smooth and weathered.

This image is the most common perspective of Uluru which people recognise, it's what people are used to seeing before they arrive at the rock, and when you drive there that is the view you see for a long, long time as you approach. The reality is Uluru looks almost

unrecognisable when you fly near it in a light plane. It is apparent that there is a 'grain' in the rock formation that runs east-west and the surface looks anything but smooth. The weathered ridges look rough and it appears as almost a different shape altogether from the one we are used to seeing from the northern approach. In 1998 I was privileged to fly to Uluru in a light aircraft and to see it first hand from 1200 metres. The thing I noticed the most was the grains in the rock align perfectly with Kata Tjuta (*otherwise known as 'the Olgas'*) over 20km away to the west.


You realise when you see this that it is part of something much bigger than what we see from the normal view, the whole region is connected in ways we just don't see or understand. It's flying above the region where this different perspective brings light and thought to the bigger picture.



Prayer can give us the bigger picture, but only if we allow God's voice to be heard over our own announcements. After all prayer is meant to be a two-way conversation. We see in **Matthew 26:39** that Jesus wanted the cup of suffering to be removed, but knowing and understanding His Father's heart He simply stated "*Yet I want your will to be done, not mine.*" – That's the bigger perspective.

The more time we spend in prayer, the more we will understand God's perspective on our situation, the more we will know His plans, His answers, His direction! Five years ago when I came to MMM, God showed me a vision for MMM Australia, in that vision I saw Australia ringed with prayer, prayer groups all around the nation praying for the work of MMM, praying for the needs of MMM, praying for the people and churches we support through the work of MMM. I know that there are people all over Australia that faithfully pray for these things, but in this one thing I have to confess – I'm greedy, I want more!

When we as a Mission are so immersed in prayer that we constantly hear God's voice, we will see his bigger picture for what we do, we will see the 'over the horizon' connections for the work we do, we will see the impact of providing adequate facilities for the churches to reach their communities. It's all a matter of perspective, of God's perspective. Can I encourage each and every person connected with MMM to - **Keep Praying!**
