THOUGHTS from the HEART



CALLED TO BUILD

I always wanted to be a builder and when I was nine years old my Dad went to Fiji with a

team from our church to help build a classroom for the Gospel School in Suva. That was all the inspiration I needed to decide that one day, I would be a builder and build for God.

After my wife and I had been married a few years and just after our first child was born in 1994, there was excitement at our church one Sunday morning as a new family had arrived from Australia. They had come to New Zealand to begin a ministry called 'Mobile Mission Maintenance' (MMM Australia) and of all the towns, cities, and churches in New Zealand they had just happened to come to ours! I immediately knew this was my kind of mission. However, I loved my building job, playing hockey; leading our church youth group and of course our growing family so my interest in MMM was restricted to helping for a few days on the occasional MMM project.

During 1998 I had a sense of unrest. I was realising if we were to follow this desire, He had placed in my heart to build for God, we would have to trust him. We applied to join MMM.

It's been years since I heard it but there is a wonderful old hymn I sang as a kid called **"Trust and Obey"** and the chorus goes like this "Trust and obey, for there is no other way, to be happy in Jesus but to trust and obey," – it's an interesting order – trust then obey.

To me, it almost seems to be the wrong way around.

Today it seems that we will obey someone or follow their lead, go along with them, even marry them but trusting them will come later if we decide to, because I just trust myself. I don't want to make myself that vulnerable that I would completely trust them. I trust my decisions; we see life from how it affects me.

In Exodus 19 God asks the people of Israel if they would obey him - 4 "You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. 5 Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine;"

The people would be thinking, "What is this covenant that we are to obey?" – they hadn't been told it yet. But the people assented to obey the covenant even though they didn't know what it was.

7 So Moses came and called the elders of the people and set before them all these words that the LORD had commanded him. 8 All the people answered together and said, "All that the LORD has spoken we will do."

God then tells the people to prepare for Moses to go up the mountain to receive the 10 commandments.

They trusted before they obeyed. That's complete trust. They had seen God work in bringing them out of Egypt, the miracles he had performed, how he had provided. They knew that if God was to give a command - it was worth following. A trust in the character of God we should all have. No two parties would do that today – agree to a covenant without knowing what it is or the terms.

After 23 years in the MMM ministry the necessity to trust and then obey is still the same, every day. Continuing to know we have an awesome, providing, faithful, unchanging God; then being prepared to obey him when he calls to the next MMM assignment, to love my neighbour, encourage my co-worker or see the God opportunity in the interruptions of the day.

Trust and obey, my friends, for there's no other way, to be happy in Jesus but to trust and obey.

FROM THE CEO'S DESK



Peace versus Stress

Philippians 4:6

And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Earlier this year I indicated to the Board this would be my last year as CEO of MMM Australia. The past two years has been pretty full on for the Board and myself as we navigated the unknowns of a global pandemic. In early June I was chatting with our Board Chair Dale Richardson and reminiscing the very early days of the pandemic, and the unknown journey we were venturing through. We had called a special Board meeting to ensure we were doing everything possible to keep the organisation pointed in the right direction.

I recall part of those discussions where we agreed the only thing we really knew was that we had to put 100% of our trust in God, that He would guide us, lead us, and provide for us. To be perfectly honest, just saying that you're going to trust God doesn't take away the stress of the time, we were all concerned for the future of the organisation. For me, there were many sleepless nights, where I would leave the bedroom so as to not keep my wife awake, and spend three or four hours in the lounge chair praying until I fell asleep.

Trust comes into its own when God's word stills the heart and the Peace of God overtakes the stress of our concerns. I found as I prayed the Holy Spirit reminding me of the promises of God, and it was the catalyst for His Peace to settle in my soul. Life is peaceful when you rest on the promises of God's Word!

Our God is Jehovah Jireh (God our Provider). He is our provider, and we do trust Him, we do put our faith in Him. My Bible tells me that Faith without works is dead! And James challenged his readers in Chapter 2:18 "someone may well say, "You have faith and I have works; show me your faith without the works, and I will show you my faith by my works." I'm constantly challenged in my spirit to do all that God calls on me to do, and constantly encouraged to see how He responds with His blessing when we are obedient.

Today MMM Australia is in a much stronger position than 9 years ago when I arrived at our Mitcham National office. I've done all I can to ensure I answered the call God placed on my heart, I've been obedient to what God has challenged me to do. It has at times been very stressful, but I've always known I've had a great team of staff and volunteers to rely on. The Board has been amazing in the response to the challenges we have faced. We look forward from this point knowing that God is still in control. We will constantly be challenged to trust



Him, and to rest on His promises for us as individuals, and for MMM as an organisation.

There are still times when I feel the stress of the burden of leadership, that goes with the job! But I'm also much more conscious to remind myself of the promises of God, and the miracles He has done in providing, leading, and guiding us in the tough times. Rest comes easier knowing the peace of God that is beyond our comprehension, this is the peace that we experience when our natural self would normally be stressed.

There are many who have prayed (and continue to pray) for me as CEO, and to each of you I say thank you, I couldn't even begin to count the number of times I've received emails or notes from people across the nation just to let me know they are praying for



me, it makes a significant difference in my life.

Prayer remains the single greatest weapon we have in ensuring that this organisation fulfils the vision and mission God has given us. Over recent months we've been working on a fiveyear strategic plan, mapping out the objectives and goals we believe God is challenging us with, which when finished (in a few weeks) will guide our planning and operations to see the work of the ministry grow and expand. It will be someone else's calling to implement this plan alongside the Board, for me I heard the call to take on the role as CEO and I can say with surety I have heard the call to step out and hand over to the next person God appoints to lead.

PROJECTS HAPPENINGS



News and images on recent projects & project teams from across the nation.

Maningrida

We can never underestimate the impact our work has on local communities! In June this year our CEO visited the remote community of Maningrida with the Chaplain for West Arnhem Ministries to investigate opportunities to serve the church there in several projects. We've done a few projects in the Maningrida community over many years. The first thing discovered was what God is doing with the people of this remote community and surrounding area. On the Sunday before they arrived there was a baptism service where 120 people were baptized – Praise God!



On the first night there they held an impromptu church service on the grassed area beside the Church which was attended by

about 100 locals, they sang, danced, and shared the message from 7:00pm through to about 12:00 (or later). We watched as around 18 young men in their early twenties performed a traditional dance to some Christian music, and were told all eighteen young men had given their life to Jesus recently coming from drug and alcohol addiction. Praise God!

We are planning two new projects for the Maningrida community, firstly a Bible Translation Centre on the Church house



land, which will be a MMM Build-A-Bond project for around April/May 2023. Secondly two Grace projects on the Church and Church House which will be part of a TopEnd Safari in July/ August 2023.



We have an opportunity to make a huge difference in this community, if you're

interested in being a part of either of these two teams please register your interest with the MMM Projects Office as soon as possible.

Gawa Community

We have also been in discussion with NT Christian Schools who have invited MMM

Invited MMM to assist with much needed Maintenance projects at Gawa Community on the northern tip of Wessel Island. We are still in the early stages of planning for



this, but it will likely be a one-off project of approximately 3 weeks in August 2023. We need to do some significant planning for this project and will need a volunteer to "live-in" on the island for 8 – 10 weeks early next year to undertake minor works and planning for the team to arrive.

We will have more information in coming months as discussions progress. This is an opportunity to immerse yourself into an indigenous community and culture to



experience what God is doing in these remote communities. Again, if you're interested in any of this contact the MMM

Build-A-Bond @ BHCC

After almost a year of production and assembly the MMM component of the work at Belgrave Heights is coming to a close. Ian Graham and his team have

done an amazing job designing and constructng, hundreds of roof truss's to top off the



new building being constructed as part of the most significant facilities upgrade at the Belgrave Heights site in the past 100 years. The difference this is making to their ministry is breathtaking, with capacity for over 450 guests in 'motel' style accommodation.

As the majority of the truss designs exceeded 12 metres in length lan and his team have had to arrange several semitrailers to ship the bundled frames to site before assembly. After assembly the problem of where to store these long trusses until they are craned to their final position.

A great effort by lan and all the volunteer team to make it all happen so smoothly.
